What are the Medicaid Managed Care Organizations (MCO) in your state that serve children, including CYSHCN?

The first row in the table below shows an example of how to complete it.

- *Population Served* refers to whether the MCO serves all children, including CYSHCN, or a specific population of children (e.g., children in foster care)
- *Specific Services* refers to whether the MCO covers specific types of services only (e.g., dental or behavioral health)
- *Geographic Area* refers to the part of the state that the MCO covers (e.g., statewide, specific counties, etc.)
- The Kaiser Family Foundation’s State Health Facts page, especially the Medicaid Managed Care Market Tracker, may be a place to start (keep in mind that MCO contracts may have been updated since the date the resource was last revised: <https://www.kff.org/state-category/medicaid-chip/>)

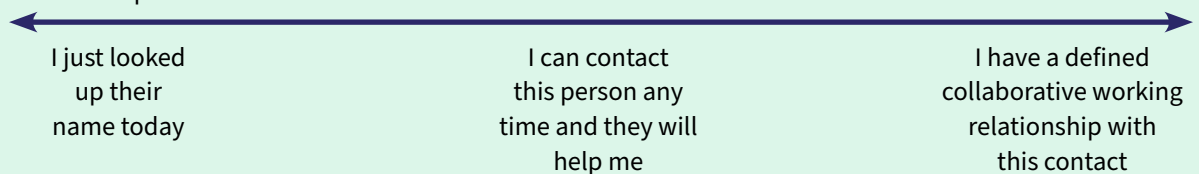
